Southern Harbour Green Team

The Hebron Project was pleased to sponsor the Newfoundland and Labrador Conservation Corps' Green Team in Southern Harbour this summer. Amber Ryan, Patrick Maher, Katie Traverse and Kaitlyn Hickey were busy with a number of initiatives, including the clean-up of a local duck pond which is home to approximately 20 ducks and a variety of other bird and animal species.

The team constructed a nesting shelter to house the ducks. As well, they repaired and constructed boardwalks to improve safety and access, trimmed overgrowth and cleaned up more than 50 bags of debris along the pond and walking trail. They also partnered with a community clean-up event and helped collect more than 85 bags of garbage! The team also



conducted a number of environmental awareness events with local youth throughout the summer to hopefully inspire others to make a difference. Well done Southern Harbour Green Team!

All Aboard for Bull Arm!!

From July to October, the Hebron Project offered public bus tours of the Bull Arm site. Tour participants got to see various areas around site including the camp, the deep water site and a vantage point overlooking both the Gravity Base Structure construction site and Topsides assembly area.

What's New?

GRAVITY BASE STRUCTURE (GBS)

- Concrete slip forming in the dry dock was completed to a height of 27 metres for the GBS centre shaft, storage cell walls, and ice wall in September
- Mechanical outfitting began in August 2013
- Currently slip forming concrete cantilever walls.

TOPSIDES

- Fabricated steel panels (deck and wall sections) are being delivered to Bull Arm from Torbay and Argentia and assembly of the living quarters (LQ) is underway.
- Fabrication of the support frame for the living quarters is also in progress. The support frame is a temporary structure that the LQ sits on while the fabricated sections are being assembled.
