The Hebron Knuckle Boom Crane Upgrade scope of work/supply includes, but is not limited to:

Offshore

1. Folding jib removal

- Execution plan
- Work pack including method statement, lifting arrangements and scaffold arrangements.
- Transportation plan, offshore to onshore facility.
- Materials for execution with associated BOM
- Labor, supervisor/coordinator. Intent is to utilize platform crew as far as possible.

2. Main motor replacement

- Execution plan
- Work pack including method statement, lifting arrangements and scaffold arrangements.
- Fabrication of lift beam
- Modification of KBC pedestal handrails where potential clash with rigging exist.
- Materials for execution with associated BOM
- Labor supervisor/coordinator. Intent is to utilize platform crew as far as possible. Require electrician to re-instate EX junction box on motor after install. Requires certification/documentation.

8. Commissioning

At a minimum this will entail a documented function test covering the full range of crane motion. Additionally, the selected supplier will be required to meet all technical and Safety, Security, Health, and Environmental (SSHE) specifications and safe work practices of EMCP and its affiliates as appropriate.

Minimum Technical Requirements

<u>Personnel</u>

Personnel shall be appropriately qualified with associated certification included in the documentation packages.

- Engineers shall hold a degree in their respective fields, be PEGNL registered (or equivalent) and in good standing.
- Trades persons shall be Journeyperson or equivalent and registered with their respective unions, or have equivalent qualifications.
- Installation of the main motor JB shall be by a qualified electrician in accordance with EX classification requirements.
- Offshore technicians/engineers shall meet requirements to travel offshore (BST, H2S Alive, WHIMIS, NL Offshore Regulatory Awareness, CAPP Medical and Flight Suit Fitting)

Relevant Experience

• Vendor shall have a proven track record of project management for engineered upgrades and associated fabrication, assembly and commissioning of hydraulically operated cranes.

<u>Documentation</u>

- Engineering documents shall be PEGNL engineer reviewed/stamped. e.g. lift arrangements and plans, technical drawings, EX certification etc.
- All fabricated items and rigging shall be supplied with manufacturing record books including but not limited to: MTRs, load test certificates, rigging inspection certificates, personnel qualifications, weld procedures etc.
- Documentation packages for each of the eight work scopes shall be delivered, as well as a final master documentation package capturing all eight work scopes.

<u>Materials</u>

• All materials utilized shall be in accordance with the referenced OEM documentation. Vendor shall clearly communicate deviations where sought.

Certifying Authority

- Vendor shall engage Lloyds Register at an early stage and accommodate associated reviews and witnesses.
- Documentation issued by LR shall be included in documentation packs.
- Note: OEM engineering has been reviewed and accepted by DNV-GL as per document 2022-5482.

This Expression of Interest (including pre-qualification) is not a pre-qualification of suppliers for other EMCP work, but is limited to the scope aforementioned. In addition, participation in this Expression of Interest (including pre-qualification), including any statements whether oral or written between EMCP and your company, shall not create or be deemed to create any binding legal relationship or contract, or be construed to do so between EMCP and your company. All costs associated with the preparation of your response to this expression of interest shall be at your expense.

This Expression of Interest (including pre-qualification) may or may not result in the issuance of an RFP/ITT and may or may not result in the award of an agreement. If you respond to this Expression of Interest (including prequalification) and your company is selected to be on the bidders' list, your company name, your designated company representative's name and business contact information may be posted on public websites.
